COUNCIL REPORTS

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Councilman Corbitt reported on the Police Department. Today October 21, 2014, the police had major issues with its phone system. The 911 calls went to Bloomfield. If one had a non-emergency call; the call may not have been answered. The Police Director is looking for hardware. The system is old and out dated, yet they are trying to repair. The system is running. They are attempting to obtain the forfeiture money. They are waiting for Administration to hire a cleaning crew. The Police Director is still waiting for the approval of crossing as well as more police office to his staff.

<u>Councilwoman Eason</u> commented on the Bond Ordinance pertaining to the Fire Department and asked about the Bond Ordinance in reference to getting a new system for the Police Department.

Council President requested that Captain Dunn gave a response to Councilwoman's Eason question.

Captain Dunn, Orange Police Department stated that he was unsure of the status on the progress. Mr. Mayes responded to the questions stating that the equipment was approved for a new

communication system at a prior meeting for approximately \$193,000.00. He stated that he would find out from the Police Director when it would be delivered and installed.

Council President requested that Mr. Mayes send an email with the status of the equipment.

Councilwoman Eason commented on the cleaning contract for the Police Department.

Councilwoman Eason commented on replacing the bar soap with soap dispensers.

Captain Dunn responded stating that the replacement had been done in 90% of the building.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

No Report

HOUSING AUTHORITY

Councilman Johnson, Jr., reported on the following:

Construction Accident

- The Construction Accident that took place on at the housing authority site at Oakwood Avenue and Parrot Street and on both side of the intersection was a result of the demolition.
- He reported that the contractor improperly gauged how the building would collapse.
- He reported that the contracting company was in contact with PSE&G directly. He reported that there were no reports on the City or the Housing Authority being directly responsible nor had there been any undue course to the City.
- He reported that The Office of Emergency Management, The Housing Authority and City's First Responders as well as the Mayor were at the scene.
- He reported that there were no deaths or injuries as a result of the construction accident. He reported that the power had been restored by PSE&G.

Governor's Award of Excellence

- He reported that The Housing Authority had won 1st Place for the Governor's Award of Excellence.
- He reported that the award for Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Walter G. Alexander Village Project.
- He reported that the project had been recognized by the HUD Agency as the leading example of housing development throughout the State.
- He reported that the story had been covered in the local newspaper Record Transcript dated October 9, 2014. He stated that Phase 3 of the Water G. Alexander Village Project would be rolled out very soon.

LIBRARY

<u>Councilwoman Jamie Summers-Johnson</u> reported that she had the answers to the questions that were asked at the previous meeting.

- She reported that regarding The Grant for \$750,000.00 that there had not received any funds to match the grant and had received an extension for May 31, 2016.
- She reported that the computers that were donated to the Library by the Orange Board of Education would be up and running the first week of November. - Mr. Scanella read an email he sent to the Governing Body for the record.
- Mr. Scanella stated they did the job in good faith.

Shawn Farrow, Esq., Counsel for Scafar Construction

- Mr. Farrow commented that there was a current litigation in progress on the matter.
- Mr. Farrow spoke on the facts of the matter giving a timeline of the project starting from two years prior to present.
- Mr. Farrow stated Scafar Constructing was on the verge of collapse because of the monies that is due to them from the City.
- He commented on the damages that would occur due to further delay of payment.

- Ms. Gordon commented on OPRA Reports.

- Ms. Gordon commented and asked question regarding the Bond Ordinance referencing the Supplemental Loan Ordinance.
- Ms. Gordon commented and asked questions regarding the PILOT Mr. Feld mentioned.
- Ms. Gordon commented on the Best Practices Number #5 in reference to the Planning Board.

Bruce Meyers, Orange, N.J. Resident

- Mr. Meyers spoke on School Funding. Mr. Myers cited cases on the funding for Abbott Schools. Mr. Meyers commented on the withholding by the Stated in reference to the schools to in excess of twenty four (24) million dollars.
- Mr. Meyers commented on an Agenda items such as the Corrective Action Plan & the Hat Factory Condo Project.
- Mr. Meyers commented on the City's Website.
- Mr. Meyers commented on transparency.

Patrick Morrissy, Director of H.A.N.D.S. Orange, N.J.

- Mr. Morrissy reported that he had very good news regarding the 1st Major Market Rate Condominiums Project in Orange, N.J., the Hat City Lofts was about to start at the corner of Nassau and Jefferson Street in the Valley.
- He stated that construction was scheduled to begin in December, 2014 or January 2015 and that the
 project would take one year to build and that when completed they would have 32 new loft condos.
- Mr. Morrissy stated that it was a nine (9) million dollar project.
- Mr. Morrissy gave the price range of the condo for \$144,000 to \$274,000.00. He stated that there was an outpour of interest and that they took twenty-two (22) deposits one weekend in June. And that there was now a waiting list.

Gloria Stewart, 62 Hampton Terrace, Orange, NJ

- Ms. Stewart stated that she was happy to see Mr. Lee, Superintendent of Orange School System requesting partnership with the City.
- Ms. Stewart commented on the condition of the Flag.
- Ms. Stewart commented and asked questions regarding the Bond Ordinance

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- Ms. Stewart commented on the condition of Scotland Road at the corner of Main Street and Scotland Road.
- Ms. Stewart thanked Councilwoman for her Library Report. She commented on the \$750,000.00 Library Grant.
- Ms. Stewart suggested that the City acquire a Recreational Center.
- Ms. Stewart commented on the City needing a B.A.
- Ms. Stewart thanked Councilman Johnson, Jr., for the Housing Authority for their report and made comments.
- Ms. Stewart commented on the City needing more businesses rather than more housing.

MOTION TO CLOSE CITIZEN'S COMMENTS

A motion was made by <u>Councilman Corbitt</u>, and seconded by <u>Councilwoman Gaunt-Butler</u> to close Citizen's Comments. The motion carries unanimously to close Citizen's Comments.

<u>Council President</u> stated that before they went into Citizen's Comments she would give the Bond Counsel a chance to answer any questions from the Governing Body regarding the Bond Ordinance due to him having to leave early.

Councilman Coley asked if they able to move forward because it was an older Bond based upon the statements made by Mr. Feld earlier.

Mr. Edward Johnson, Bond Counsel responded with a yes under Section 39 of the Local By-Law. Councilman Coley asked about the interest rate.

Mr. Johnson responded stating there wasn't a new bond issued and that they would not be issuing bonds going forward and that therefore would be no new interest on bonds. He stated that it was really a Re-appropriation Ordinance.

Councilman Coley asked if it would be able to be settled that night based upon how it was structured. Council President stated that there had to be a 1st reading and 2nd reading of the Bond Ordinance.

Councilman Corbitt asked if it was necessary to go back before the Local Finance Board.

Mr. Johnson responded stating that it was not necessary because it was approved by the Finance Board originally.

<u>Council President</u> addressed Mr. Mapp on a question that was asked about re-purposing the funds vs. taking out a loan. She asked that Mr. Mapp give a comparison as to which scenario would be better for the tax payers of Orange.

Mr. Mapp responded stating that the repurposing of the funds would be in the best for the tax payers the City of Orange. He stated that they opted out not to getting the N.J.I.T loan to avoid the City incurring more debt.

Council President asked if the administration had begun the loan process.

Mr. Mapp responded with a yes stating the loan process had been well on its way and they interrupted the process.

Councilman Coley asked about Resolution 69-2014.

Mr. Mapp stated there was a resolution on the Agenda that night seeking to rescind the previous resolution which authorized the application to N.J.E.I.T.

Councilman Cobitt requested the dollar amount that remained from the 2008 and 2002 Ordinance.

NEW JERSEY

<u>Council President</u> apologized to Mr. Elliot for forgetting to allow him to speak during citizen's comment. She stated that he would get a chance to speak.

Mr. Mapp responded stating that as of the end of December when the audit was completed that \$4,783,449.81 remained. He stated that the amount was around 3 million dollars until they made the adjustment to correct the error of around \$1.6 million dollars that was erroneously reflected. He stated that he alluded to it at the last meeting.

Councilman Corbitt stated that Mr. Mapp responded with a no when he asked if there were monies remaining other than the \$1.2 million dollars at the last meeting.

Mr. Mapp stated that maybe the question was unclear. Mr. stated that there were two ordinances involved and that if <u>Councilman Corbitt</u> was referring to Ordinance 08-08 there was only about \$32,000.00 against it. Mr. Mapp stated that the Ordinance that had the \$4 million was the ordinance that they repurposing the \$1.25 million from that ordinance to place it against Ordinance 08-08 which was the Ordinance from where they will make the disbursements.

Councilman Corbitt commented that the Ordinance from 2002 that had the \$4.7 million dollars.

Mr. Mapp responded stating that he was correct.

Council President asked Mr. Mobley to step to the podium.

<u>Council President</u> commented that the project had been done in support of the possibility of new redevelopment and needs that were done for the City's water infrastructure.

<u>Council President</u> requested that Mr. Mobely speak to future needs for the expansion of the water infrastructure.

Mr. Mobley stated that on that day there had been a water leak at 55 Main Street and another leak at Freeway Drive West and Webster Place. He stated that they dealt with an issue on Argyle where the sewer main collapsed. He stated that there would always be situations that would need to be addressed. He stated that they had an old system and that those kinds of situation would always come up. He stated that the issues with the old pump station where they were losing two hundred thousand gallons of water per day had been resolved, but they did have a few issues such as that with the pumps in the new station that was being addressed. He also stated that there would always be maintenance issues and they did stay on top of those issues as well.

Council President stated that she would be in contact with Mr. Johnson regarding the public hearing. Mr. Mapp stated that there was an error in the title of the ordinance on the Agenda. He stated that the title showed 1.5

Council President stated that there was a revised Agenda.

Mr. Walter Elliot, 156 South 12th Street, Newark, NJ.

- Mr. Elliot stated that the worked at 26 Main street the offices of Local Talk and he was present on behalf of Local Talk.
- Mr. Elliot Announced their 5th Annual High School Public Speaking Competition. He stated that
 the preliminary event would be 10:00 A.M at Irvington Municipal Hall and Finals would be
 11:00A.M. at Bella Italia Restaurant, Orange, NJ.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilwoman Summers-Johnson stated that her meetings dates were approved by the Board of Education and that she would be having her South Ward Community Meetings four times this year on

NEW JERSEY

November 12, 2014, December 17, 2014, March 11, 2015 and June 10, 2015 at 6:00PM at Heywood Avenue School.

Councilman Johnson, Jr. stated he and his neighbors had been on a long journey to having their street repaired in the West Ward. He stated that he was happy to announce that repairs were scheduled to done. He thanked the Administration as well as Mr. Mayes from the Department of Public Works. He stated that the residents in the 4th District of the West Ward had begun investing in their properties. Councilwoman Gaunt-Butler stated that she was very disappointed that the meetings were not being televised. She agreed with a member of the public about the corrective action plan and that she had been asking about the corrective action plan and the progress from it for the last year.

Councilwoman Gaunt-Butler expressed her concerns regarding the Bond Ordinance and stated that there should be a spending plan and that they need not spend all the money at once.

Councilwoman Gaunt-Butler asked Mr. Mapp if the accounts for Certificates of Availability were being funded at that time and if they were monies in the accounts.

Mr. Mapp responded stating that anytime one received Certificates of Availability of funds that it meant that CFO had certified that those funds were available.

Councilwoman Gaunt-Butler thanked Ms. Lauressa Bradshaw for all her work while with the Clerk's Office and wished her well.

Councilwoman Eason also thanked Ms. Bradshaw for all her work in the Clerk's Office especially for her work done on OPRA's.

Councilwoman Eason commented on the recognition the Council does for diseased residents. She read a thank you letter from Ms. Kingslow's daughter regarding the proclamation for her mother.

Councilwoman Eason thanked Mr. Mayes for fixing the leak on High and Washington Street. She stated that she was still waiting for her signs for Cleveland and Washington Street.

Councilwoman Eason asked Mr. Mayes about the status of the Planning Board Computer.

Mr. Mayes responded stating that the computer was in his office and that it was scheduled to be installed the following day.

Councilwoman Eason asked about the status of PSE&G fixing the roads Main and High Street. Mr. Mayes stated that PSE&G was schedule to go back to the location to fix the roads and that he met with their representative Mr. Everton Scott.

Councilwoman Eason asked about an update on the parking meters.

Mr. Mayes stated that it was a question for Mr. Mobley and that he would have an update for the next meeting.

Council woman Eason commented that the Homecoming Parade and that the Council was expected to march in the parade.

Councilman Corbitt stated that he would not be able to march in the parade due to the Local Talk Public Speaking Contest being held on the same day.

Councilman Corbitt commented on the prizes for the Local Talk Contest. He stated that the City of Orange had six students participating in the contest.

Councilman Corbitt asked about the status of the Municipal Clerk's position being filled.

Council President responded stating that the Personnel Committee would update him in the near future. Councilman Cobitt commented on the meeting not being televised.

Councilman Cobitt asked if they would be able to get Gramco, the company who installed the video equipment to take a look at equipment and assess what the issues were.

Council President stated that the issue was Administration giving access to the equipment.

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Councilman Corbitt stated that the Council should find but what could be done if Gramco was not given access to the equipment.

Councilman Corbitt thanked Ms. Bradshaw for all her hard work done in the Clerk's Office.

Councilman Coley asked about the timeline to complete an OPRA Request and commented on the OPRA Report that was given to the Council.

Councilman Coley requested that the Agenda be placed on the City's Website once it was finalized.

Councilman Coley suggested that the Governing Body created their website.

Councilman Coley commented on the Environmental Commission and the Administration not doing anything with that commission. He stated that they should revisit the resolution and change the language and give the control back to the Governing Body.

Councilman Coley asked Mr. Mapp if the Budget Worksheet had been completed.

Mr. Mapp stated that he would have it very soon.

<u>Councilman Coley</u> commented on the condition of the old police station at 590 Lincoln Avenue stating that the Governing Body should transfer the property to the School Board.

Council President stated that the corrective action plan would be removed from the Agenda and be place on the agenda for the November 5th meeting.

Council President addressed Mr. Mapp regarding the Bill List and that Salary and Wages information was omitted.

Mr. Mapp responded stating that the data had not been entered in the general ledger system.

Council President asked about the timeline of the information being available.

Mr. Mapp responded stating that the information would be available for the next meeting.

Council President commented on a duplicate on Page 15 of the Bill List.

Mr. Mapp stated that they were two different Purchase Orders and did not know them to be duplicates. Council President asked about the refunding to the Board of Education on Page 13 of the Bill List coming out to of the proper fund.

Mr. Mapp he stated it would be refunded from the fund from which it was credited.

<u>Councilwoman Eason</u> stated that pertaining to Salary and Wages for all the employees that they answered yes to the in the Best Practices stating that the information was available.

Mr. Mapp stated that the salary and wages could be found on the City's Website or the Clerk's Office. Council President commented that Ms. Gordon asked about the GRC Reports that had been rendered in her favor. Council President stated that she had instructed that the Clerk's office to send all the decisions from the GRC to all Council Members.

Council President requested that Ms. Stewart speak to Mr. Mayes regarding payment of the \$1.2 million dollars to Scafar.

Council President asked Mr. Mayes about the various roads needing to be fixed due to potholes.

Mr. Mayes stated that they fixed potholes two to three times per week. He stated that if he received the areas he would direct his staff to the areas.

Council President stated that Ms. Steward mentioned Main and Scotland Road.

Councilman Coley mentioned a few other areas with potholes.

Council President made some announcements

She stated that their liaison for the County, Mr. Garrett was not able to be at the meeting due to training he had to attend, but that he wanted to her to announce that the following day Community Development Block Grant would be having the CDBG Awards for 2014-2015 Year at 12:00 noon at the Essex County Hall of Records and that all were invited.

- She stated that the City would be hosting Toys for Tots and asked if people donated foods, canned goods or toy that they be dropped off at the Orange Police Department, the Orange Public Library or City Hall.

<u>Council President</u> requested the Council Members to submit their appointment for the Citizen's Advisory Committee to the Clerk's Office if they had not already done so for appointment for the next meeting.

<u>Council President</u> commented on the Environmental Commission stating that Council Members could make appointments to the Commission and that it should be emailed to the Clerk's Office as well as to the Legislative Research Officer. She commented that Councilman Coley made an appointment for Ms. Katalin Gordon and that the resolution would be coming forth soon.

He stated it was reflected on the Agenda that there was a second Ordinance 20-2014 and that if the council chose to adopt Ordinance 20-2014 on first reading they would have had no choice but to withdraw 19-2014.
