The Department of Community Services works to promote the well-being of children, young adults and the senior community.


We enhance the quality of life by promoting good physical and mental health, preventing illness and injury, protecting the environment, and providing recreational services to residents of all ages.


Animal Control

- Daily city wide animal canvass patrol.
- Enforcement state mandated rabies vaccinations.
- Investigates animal bites/attacks/fights/cruelty complaints.
- Abandoned building inspections with Mayor's Inspections Task Force.
- Capture and remove stray, uncontrolled, or abused animals from undesirable conditions.
- Educate the public about animal welfare, and animal control laws and regulations.
- Examine animals for injuries or malnutrition, and arrange for any necessary medical treatment.
