- 3. Has the local governing body, the mayor and the city clerk received a written legal opinion as to the validity of this official political free speech limitations and prior restraints on oral public budget hearing questions and comments policy and procedure?
- 4. What is the status of Orange's CY 2019 Audit and Amended CY 2020 User Friendly Budget?
- 5. What is the status of the written responses to my open and outstanding June 16, 2020 introduced CY 2020 Budget public hearing questions?
