

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ORANGE TOWNSHIP, CHAPTER 200, ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" SECTION 200-52-1 HANDICAPPED PARKING

SPACES. (39 HAMPTON TERRACE)

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Coleman has in his possession a special identification card issued by the Motor Vehicle Commission of the State of New Jersey designating him as handicapped; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Coleman requested that a handicapped parking space be established in front of his home.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Council of the City of Orange Township as follows:

Section 200-52-1 be amended to include a handicapped parking space at the following location:

39 Hampton Terrace

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, approval and publication pursuant to law.

WHEREAS, the City of Orange Township, New Jersey mourns the passing of Nathaniel P. Coleman; and

WHEREAS, we come together during this time of sadness to pay tribute to and celebrate the life of Nathaniel P. Coleman who was a vital and central force in his family and valued member of the community; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel P. Coleman was born in East Orange, New Jersey, on July 13, 1927, to the late Florine Pankey and Joseph C. Coleman. He graduated from East Orange High School in 1945, where he played football. He went on to study chemistry, receiving his bachelor's degree and teaching credentials at Seton Hall University, and his master's degree at Rutgers University; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel P. Coleman Nat was married to Catherine Ray Coleman on August 16, 1951, at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Orange. They enjoyed a long and loving union for 64 years until her passing in 2015; and

He led Troop 14 of the Boy Scouts of America in Orange, and was a longtime member of the Men of Essex, the Sickle Cell Disease Foundation of Orange, the Orange Education Association Bowling League and the Orange Community Problem Task Force. He was a charter member of the Hampton Terrace Block Association and served as President for many years.

WHEREAS, Nathaniel P. Coleman and his wife loved traveling and spent most summers in Williamsburg, Virginia. Weekend trips to historic landmarks were common during their children's formative years. They introduced their grandchildren to the joys of travel with cross-country summer road trips and experienced several cruises and international voyages as a couple. Kate loved to entertain and Nathaniel P. Coleman executed the logistics. Together, they created countless memorable events with family and friends. Birthdays, holidays and summer barbecues were always times of great joy; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel P. Coleman entered into eternal life on December 16, 2019; and
