**TITLE: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 200 OF THE CITY OF ORANGE TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL CODE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE 18-2018 ENTITLED HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACES. (39 Hampton Terrace)  
(Sponsored by Councilmember-At-Large Adrienne Wooten)**

**WHEREAS**, every two years, commencing in 1995, the Public Works Department shall send a form to each recipient of a handicapped parking space containing a certification to be signed by the recipient certifying his or her continuing qualifications and need for a handicapped parking space; and

**WHEREAS**, each form shall contain instructions for its completion and return within 30 days of receipt. It is the applicant's responsibility to notify the Public Works Department in the event that the designated handicapped parking space is no longer required. Within 30 days after the due date for the return of the certifications, the Public Works Department shall submit a list to the City Council of all handicapped parking spaces for which certifications were not returned; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council may then act at a subsequent meeting to terminate the approval of those handicapped parking spaces for which certifications were not received; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition, after verification by the Public Works Department, the City Council may act at any time to terminate the approval of those handicapped parking spaces held by recipients that have died or have moved from the City of Orange.

**WHEREAS**, the handicapped parking sign has been removed from 39 Hampton Terrace; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Orange Township expresses sympathy at the loss of Mr. Nathaniel Coleman.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Orange Township that Section 200-2-1 be and is hereby amended to repeal a handicapped parking space at the location as follows:  
(39 Hampton Terrace)

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that this ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, approval, and publication pursuant to law.

**WHEREAS**, Nathaniel Coleman has in his possession a special identification card issued by the Motor Vehicle Commission of the State of New Jersey designating him as handicapped; and

**WHEREAS**, Nathaniel Coleman requested that a handicapped parking space be established in front of his home.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Municipal Council of the City of Orange Township as follows:


Section 200-52-1 be amended to include a handicapped parking space at the following location:


39 Hampton Terrace



**WHEREAS, we come together during this time of sadness to pay tribute to and celebrate the life of Nathaniel P. Coleman who was a vital and central force in his family and valued member of the community; and**
