Business Administrator Hartwyk provided the following comments:

• Ordinance 59-2020

- Bond Ordinance is for the Russo II Project at 33-51 Lincoln Avenue and 60 Scotland Road similar to the Crane Street Project.
- The developer is spending \$3.8 million dollars to build a parking garage that after operation costs the revenues will be coming to the City.
- The \$250,000 is for infrastructure improvements, which includes but is not limited to, repairs to sidewalks, street lighting, landscaping.

• Ordinance 60-2020

- The tax exemption is for the Russo II Project.

Ordinance 61-2020

- Special Emergency Appropriation to fund an anticipated deficit in operations in the Water/Sewer Utility Fund.
- Per Governor Murphy's Executive Order during the Pandemic, the City is prohibited from shutting off water on delinquent accounts.
- Believes the City will be able to recover deficient in less than 5 years.

• Ordinance 62-2020

- Technical ordinance and change does not provide any fiscal impact to the City.
- The Court Administrator will be moved to this position at the same pay.

• Resolution 460-2020

- Authorizing the submission of an application to the Local Finance Board requesting approval of the bond ordinance for \$250,000.

• Resolution 461-2020

- No money paid to the City.
- New minority and local developer who has accepted all terms outlined.

The City Clerk commented on the following:

• Ordinance 58-2020

- The Finance Committee recommend postponing to the next meeting of December 15, 2020 for amendments.

• Resolution 458-2020

- Resolution was amended to include **not** to exceed.
