The City Clerk announced the requirements of N.J.S.A. 10:4-9 et. seq., "Sunshine Law" has been met. A notice of this meeting was sent to the Record Transcript, published in the Star Ledger on September 2, 2021, posted on the Bulletin Board in City Hall, the Council's Website (www.orangetwpnjcc.org), the City's Website (www.ci.orange.nj.us) and filed in the Office of the City Clerk.

There were no minutes to approve

REPORTS

- The City Clerk reported that the City Clerk's office collected \$625.00 in December 2021 and \$60 in January 2022. She also stated the Historic Preservation Commission collected \$70.00 in December 2021 and 140.00 in January 2022: \$140.00.
- There were no Constable reports.
- The Clerk reported there were 132 OPRA requests received, 85 completed and 47 pending for the month of January 2022.
- COUNCIL REPORTS Council President directs Clerk to file reports.

- O Vincent Vitiello, Police Chief stated that there was another officer hired by the Construction Company and cones placed on Crane Street due to former complaints. Officers have been directed to take notes during their shift if they notice street lights out so DPW can be notified. There was an arrest of 7 known gang members, confiscated two guns and drugs on Central Place. ICAT, LGBGT, SEEK and Jewish Orthodox training has been given to the force. Councilman Montague, III raised traffic concerns near Park Avenue School. Chris Hartwyk stated a survey has been taken and the results should roll out soon.
- o Fire Chief, Gerard Long, stated that smoke detector installations are on-going and residents can make an appointment by calling 973-518-1703. There are two trucks in need of repair, we still assist surrounding towns, three fire fighters have completed CPR training, and the OHS JR. ROTC will be taking CPR training as they shadow fire fighters. He also stated there are 3CR Instructors, the goal is to have 7. Councilman Montague, III requested CPR training for coaches.
- o Public Works Director, Marty Mayes stated we want to keep the snow machinery up and operating. DPW is setting up road and park projects when the weather breaks and fencing of all the parks is on that agenda. College Park will be open for the spring. Planning substantial work in Colgate Park even though it is a challenge because there is some unknown vandalism. Planning a complete make over for Ropes Park late spring and applying for Green Acres funding. Council President Coley requested a written overview to follow the progress report. Council Vice President asked to add "park is closed" signs up and no trespassing signs. Councilman Johnson, Jr. asked about the grant which is earmarked and infrastructure on sidewalk and curbs. The Dwayne Street update is forth coming. Chris Hartwyk gave an update on the roof repair and reported the gas will be purchased between wholesale and retail price. Marty Mayes gave an update on the completion of the fuel station, the last step is an IT stage installing cameras and chips to prevent theft.
- o Planning Director, Laquana Best reported all redevelopment projects are moving as scheduled. The Orange Chamber of Commerce will hold its second Community Commercial and Residential Seminar in collaboration with East Orange & Irvington on March 10th, 6-8pm at Sandwiches Unlimited and the tickets are \$10. She thanked all who supported the PSE&G event. Councilwoman Summers-Johnson asked the Director to give clarification for the residents about how projects are approved. Chris Hartwyk stated the project for the new recreation center is honing on the design. Director Best stated the Wawa would be complete late summer early fall they are dealing with water connection issues. The area study has a list of properties set for condemnation which will be discussed at the Planning Board meeting on next Wednesday.
- Tax Collector, Paula Ferreira stated that 1st quarter tax collection letters have been mailed, and letters for payments due on March 1st will be mailed this week. Councilwoman Summers Johnson requested publishing the new phone list to residents. Councilman Ross commended the Tax Collector for the rate of tax collection. Councilman Johnson, Jr. inquired about enrollment in to the Tax Freeze which is through the state.
- o Tax Assessor, Christopher Murray gave an update on the rebound which is in the final stages and residents will receive notification within the week. Councilwoman Summers-Johnson shared complaints about PPA keeping appointments. Councilwoman Wooten gave a message from a resident.
- O Chief Financial Officer, Nile Clements stated that the Annual Debt Statement has been filed with the state. The Max is 3.5% and Orange is at 2.604% down from 2.999% in 2020. Councilman Montague, III inquired about the Budget Meeting which will be April.

There were no communications and petitions.

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The City Clerk announced "SPECIAL NOTICE: Please be apprised anyone wishing to discuss Agenda or General Items shall be allowed to participate in this portion of the Council Meeting via the audio call in number and video conferencing platform by stating their name and address when directed to do so by the Council President. All public comments submitted though electronic mail or written letter before the meeting shall be read aloud by the City Clerk. The City Council reserves the right to respond to not respond during the meeting to any citizen's questions or comments. If the Council wishes to address any comments, it shall be done during the remote public meeting.

James H. Ward, III of 743 Haxtun Ave. expressed how pleased he was to hear about the advancements in fixing the embarkations at Orange schools. He also called for a pause on the PSE&G sub-station project to have proper community review.

Gloria Fisher, 254 Ellen Drive shared concerns about Animal Control and being able to contact someone in the department. Chris Hartwyk told her to contact him tomorrow to connect her. Vincent DeFilippo also gave her a number to call and to contact him the next day to get a direct connection.

Kweli Campbell, 552 Argyle Ave inquired about the Open Tax Committee as she has been placed on this committee. The City Clerk directed her to call the Clerk's office to be connected to Keith Pressey.

The City Clerk read comments from Aubrey Murdock, 540 Liberty St. she wrote in response to Council replies on Citizens comments and petition last week regarding new development in Orange.

Karen Wells expressed concerns about PSE&G and why didn't this come before the Historic Preservation Commission. She also wanted to understand why the tax assessment re-evaluation is being done eight years versus ten years. Chris Murray and Chris Hartwyk addressed the process the department is following.

Jamar Young, 678 Haxtun Ave, expressed concerns about tax assessment and the goal behind the tax re-evaluation and what we expect to come from this. Christopher Murray responded to how it would benefit the city.

William Hathaway, District Leader for West 3 was opposed the Ordinance 84-2022, American Jobs Plan. He recommended that the Administration, Councilwomen Summers-Johnson and Wooten consider when this Ordinance returns there is Community input. Funds should be directed to the roads, infrastructure of the trains. There should be more awareness for more jobs and small businesses.

Quantavia Hilbert, 353 Lincoln Ave, Addressed DPW Marty Mayes, Chief Vincent Vitiello and Tim Walker and requested more safety, Crossing Guards, road markings, and engineers to revisit for more traffic re-enforcement on Scotland Rd, between Main St. and Central Ave., as there are multiple schools in this area. The overpass makes it more dangerous.

The City Clerk read a statement from Jeffrey Feld that asked are We the People and not the mayor, certain redevelopers and the local housing authority the ultimate clients and constituents of the City Attorney and local governing body? When will the CY 2020 Audit and the "as of Dec. 31, 2021" annual debt statement be posted on a public website? How many non-tax appeal

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matters are pending against the municipality? Under what categories do the other litigation retention matters listed on the Feb. 15, 2022 agenda fall? Joseph Cruz Jr- ESX-L-0013-22; Alice Lang-ESX-L-5170-18; Kason Scruggs ESX-L-1742- 20; Kyanna Pulard-2:17-CV-11304-KM, Louis DeSources-2:18-CV-09324- Sd; Kerri PayneESX-L-8869-20 5. How does Orange intend to stop and to mitigate the public trust fund cash bleeding related to its in-house legal department and litigation? 6. Has the City reserved any monies for all the litigation matters listed on the Feb. 15, 2022 Agenda? 7. Does the local governing body receive monthly or quarterly outstanding litigation update reports? 8. How does the local governing body monitor and review the professional work product of these cases? 9. In 2017, did Attorney Feld, BA Hartwyk and City Attorney Pennington negotiate a global Feld related settlement that the mayor rejected upon the advice of special outside defense counsel? 10. In 2013, when the local governing body approved the contested Feld X Walter G. Alexander Phase III long term tax exemption agreement, who were the chairs of the Housing Authority of the City of Orange (Cliff Ross) and the Orange Housing Development Corp. (Avram White)? . Does the Feb. 15, 2011 sworn testimony of the City's then outside redevelopment consultant (Thomas Banker) undermine and contradict the City's Remanded Feld X contention that the Long Term Tax Exemption Law does not contain a 10% of revenues minimum floor on all non-Redevelopment Area Bond transactions?

A motion to close Citizens Comments was made by Councilmember Summers-Johnson and seconded by Councilman Montague, III.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilwoman Jamie Summers-Johnson reported she conducted a vaccine event that administered Covid-19 boosters, Vaccines and testing where they also gave 40 bags of food, clothes and toys to residents. She also had South Ward Rental Assistance Association to give residents information that could help them. There will be a meeting on February 23 at 7pm a community policing event.

Councilman Weldon Montague, III spoke about an event where Covid-19 vaccines will be administered. He would also be distributing new clothes on Monday. Give any information for churches or any entity which will take the donations for distribution.

Councilman Adrienne Wooten suggested that everyone get their yearly check-up especially since it is National Hear Month. She and Councilwoman Summers-Johnson will collaborate with Valley Arts. Upcoming events including: March 17th Women's History Month Proclamation Event, March 19th Team Girl Empowerment (Teen dating), March 24th Teen Mental Health and March 25th Senior Forum. Every Saturday in March at the Field House will be Soup Saturday's, food bags and PPE will be distributed. Looking forward to working on Resolution 84-2022. Register your pet at City Hall tomorrow. She requested a follow-up for people given tenure.

Councilman Clifford R. Ross requested an update from the administration when a new project is in its infancy stages. He requested the City Developer address the city development plans. He also requested a Committee be formed consisting of Administration and three Councilmembers to discuss: 1. Affordable housing 2. Conversatio0ns with developers to discuss contributions to our Fire Department, Police Department, Library Water Well, and Schools 3. Request the developer contribute to Fire and Police personnel. Chris Hartwyk stated we need to get legal clarification for items we can ask of developers. Councilman Ross stated there is a program with 18 slots for Lifeguard training.

Councilman Harold Johnson, Jr. yielded his time

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Council Vice President Tency Eason also stated in essence of time she wanted to ask all to stay prayed up for our city during this difficult time of the pandemic. She thanked the BA and Fire Department and offered her support.

Council President Kerry Coley stated he would follow up with the BA off line concerning the parking situation on Park Place.
