WHEREAS, as a newlywed, her family was one of the first to reside in the Walter G. Alexander buildings on Parrow Street when they opened in 1952; and

WHEREAS, this is where she raised her eight children, who all were educated in the Orange school system; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Irene Moore loved her community, she worked for Mayor Joel Shain, worked as a long-time food service worker at Lincoln Avenue school, and served as a Home Friend to many elderly residents throughout the city.

WHEREAS, Mrs. Irene Moore could be often seen walking in the neighborhood, greeting everyone with a smile and a story.
