

OBJECTIVES

Objective Number: 1

Short Description: Enhance Basketball Court Surface Quality

Detailed Description

The City of Orange Township is requesting funding to replace the flooring and subbase of the basketball courts located at Colgate Park in the City of Orange. The Colgate Park Basketball Court Improvement Project seeks to update this recreational facility that serves the physical and social needs of the surrounding community.

Methods

The City will complete this project by putting out an RFP for the requested service. The hired firm will complete the project within one year of the grant award notification.

Evaluation

The City will ask for public feedback on the newly renovated basketball courts. The City will offer surveys to collect data from members of the community.

Application Program Component: Colgate Park Basketball Court

Scope of Services

The City of Orange Township is an urban community in Essex County that is roughly ten miles from midtown New York City, and only three miles from the City of Newark, New Jersey's largest City. The Township is 2.2 square miles and maintains a population density of approximately 15,500 persons per square mile. Orange is one of the most culturally diverse, economically challenged, and densely populated municipalities in the State. According to the most recent Census, 74.9% of Orange residents rent and reside in multiunit homes, reiterating the need for accessible and safe open space. Approximately 1,114 families and 5,454 of our residents live below the federal poverty line, including 24.6% of residents under age 18 and 20.6% of those over the age of 65.

Orange Township is requesting \$100,000 in funding from the DCA Local Recreation Improvement Project to replace the flooring of the basketball courts at Colgate Park.

This project seeks to rehabilitate a dilapidated yet important open space into a first-class facility in the heart of Orange. The basketball courts need to be replaced to extend their lifespan and recreational usefulness.

The reconstruction of the basketball courts will help sustain the community's love for the sport. These facilities are not only used by the general public but used by the many summer camps and recreational programs in the community. Since Orange is a densely populated and majority low-income community, public spaces are vital to the health and quality of life to the people it serves. With the requested updates, the City anticipates an increase in attendance to the park. The City's plan to update Colgate Park will increase overall quality of life for the residents of Orange.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The City of Orange Township requests \$100,000 from the NJDCA Local Recreation Improvements Grant Program to resurface the flooring of the basketball courts at Colgate Park. The basketball court has deteriorated due to extensive use and exposure to the elements. The requested funds will be used to remove and discard of the current surface materials, purchase the necessary asphalt and geotextiles, and install the new subbase and surface. Colgate Park is located in the City's East Ward. It is .6 acres in size and includes two basketball courts, one pool, and one playground area. Orange has one regional park (Orange Park), two general use parks (Metcalf Park and Central Playground), two neighborhood parks (Alden Street Park and Colgate Park), one Mini-Park (Ropes Park) and two open space parks (William Street Park and Military Commons Park). The only other recreational site within the East ward is the military commons which is comprised of .5 acres of open space. The park is approximately 105 years of age, with some temporary updates done over the years. Colgate Park has not been completely renovated since the mid-1980s. The projects referenced in this application will facilitate an active and safe recreation area at Colgate Park. These improvements are long overdue and are critical to the sustainability of the infrastructure of the courts.

PROJECT NARRATIVE**

The surface and subbase of the basketball court at Colgate Park have been degraded due to their extensive use and exposure to the elements. The basketball courts remain open year-round and are located outdoors without overhead protection. The popularity of basketball in the community is evident in the fact that it is the only recreational facility present in all four of the City's wards. Replacing the surface of the basketball courts will allow for its continued use and further the City's commitment to providing quality recreational facilities that meet the needs of its community.

The City of Orange Township will identify a qualified vendor through the issuance of a Request for Proposal (RFP). Once this vendor is determined, they will be responsible for the improvements under the oversight of the Department of Public Works. This will include: the excavation of the site, procurement of materials, installation, and painting.

The City's commitment to providing quality recreational facilities has been long established. In 2013, the City utilized funding from the State to develop College Park, a multi-purpose recreation facility. In the Master Plan adopted in November of 2018, the City announced its intention to update its existing recreational facilities to align with the current open space and recreational trends. The Department of Recreation immediately began working towards achieving this initiative, building upon the existing recreational improvement programs. In 2019, the department used the \$10,000 awarded from the Bill Belichick Foundation to implement a youth lacrosse program. The Department of Public Works has also successfully leveraged funds from various sources to maintain and improve the quality of the recreational facilities available to its residents. The Department used funding from the DEP Green Acres program to build new amenities and update existing structure on Colgate Park, High Street Park, and Ropes Park. Funding from the DCA's Local Recreation Improvement Grant funded renovations to the pool and tennis courts on Metcalf Park.

The City of Orange Township currently ranks 21st on the Municipal Revitalization Index.

**Local Recreational Improvement 2023
PROJECT STATEMENT OF NEED**

The City of Orange Township is a densely populated urban area, that is projected to continue growing in population. There are currently 34,002 residents living within the City's 2.21 miles. Its population is extremely ethnically diverse, it is 59.2% Black, 4.9% White, 30.8% Hispanic, 1.5% Asian, and 3.6% Other or Two or More Races. The City has an unemployment rate of 5.3%, 21.4% of its residents live in poverty, and 20% of residents receive SNAP benefits. The City of Orange has been designated as a distressed city for all State and Federal programs. Colgate Park, specifically, is within an identified overburdened community census tract.

The high-density of the City results in an average of 15,568 people living per square mile. This far exceeds the State average of 1,263 people per square mile. Consequently, a majority of the population live in apartments or multi-family homes with little access to private spaces for recreation. This increases the importance of the City's commitment to providing quality public recreational facilities. These recreational spaces facilitate community bonds and promote mental and physical health. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) notes the importance of these spaces, urging communities to take the necessary steps to create and maintain them. The updates to the basketball courts in Colgate Park will help preserve an atmosphere that promotes exercise and social bonding.
