## **MATTERS FOR DISCUSSION**

## **COVID Update**

Health Officer Vincent DeFilippo stated that New Jersey cases are in the green state. The transmission rate is moderate. The pandemic emergency federal state stopped last week. H3N2 is the new Covid strand. Every Friday until the end of the month there is a Mobile Unit in front of City Hall administering vaccines and taking blood pressure. The numbers for Covid are getting better. As of yesterday there were a 100 positive cases, 153 people hospitalized, eleven in intensive care and three on ventilators. Today there are 161 positive cases, 100 people hospitalized, thirty people in intensive care and seven on ventilators. Continue to wear a mask if you are uncomfortable with numbers. There is a high pollen rate and an increased number of ticks.

# Police Initiative on Mental Health - Vincent Vitiello, Police Chief

Police Chief Vincent Vitiello stated the initiative began on Monday, May 15, 2023. In collaboration with the City of East Orange and Clara Maas, the City is starting The ARRIVE Program. The purpose of the program is to begin an innovative policing program which stands for Alternative Response to Reduce Instances of Violence and Escalation. This is to assist people experiencing mental health cases. Three days in the week, Orange Police will ride with Mental Health Specialist, and two days of the week, East Orange Police will do the same. Responding to calls in each city and responding to homeless residents as well. There is a system in place to do follow-up calls. The department is in the process of speaking to Mental Health Officials in possibilities of hiring them. There has already been two calls for the ARRIVE program, Officers called AT1. Council President Tency A. Eason inquired about the Chaplains which are called in to provide additional comfort with this initiative. Clara Maas and University Hospital are the hospitals that the City is building relationships with on this issue. Councilmember Weldon M. Montague, III gave a testimony of a case he was witness to and was pleased with the results. Police Chief Vincent Vitiello stated there are also officers who have (CIT) Critical Incident Training which helps to deescalate situations.
