**TITLE:** RESOLUTION DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND RATIFYING A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ORANGE TOWNSHIP AND SHAUGER PROPERTY SERVICES, INC., 429 DODD STREET, EAST ORANGE, NEW JERSEY 07017 FOR EMERGENCY MAIN WATER AND SEWER REPLACEMENTS ON THOMAS STREET (BETWEEN BURNSIDE STREET AND CARROLL STREET) IN THE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,679,416.95.

**WHEREAS**, on June 23, 2023, National Water Main (NWM) investigated what was reported by the EPA to be raw sewage escaping into the Second River Brook; and

**WHEREAS**, upon further investigation, there was visual confirmation, specifically at the end of Kearny Street where sewage was evident running into the brook;

**WHEREAS**, NWM personnel along with City personnel and Shauger Property Services walked the brook as far as possible to try and flowing the leak. NWM continued its investigation by videoing the storm line that runs under SPS parking lot, to Dodd Street and connects to a storm inlet at the intersection of Dodd Street and Thomas Blvd; and

**WHEREAS**, that inlet showed signs of raw sewage running through it, a manhole halfway up Tomas Blvd was surcharged, filled with sewage; and


**WHEREAS**, NWM jetted that line and broke free any blockage. As the video camera showed, the problem was discovered at the intersection of Thomas Street and Burnside Street where an underground storm drain directly under the sewer line, causing the storm and sewer to co-mingle, releasing raw sewage; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6, any contract may be negotiated or awarded for a contracting unit without public advertising for bids and bidding therefore, notwithstanding that the contract price will exceed the bid threshold, when an emergency affecting the public health, safety or welfare requires the immediate delivery of goods or the performance of services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Qualified Purchasing Agent is satisfied that an emergency exists and recommends that a contract be awarded to Shauger Property Services, Inc.; and

**WHEREAS**, a Certification of Availability of Funds is not required given the emergency appropriation.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Municipal Council of the City of Orange Township be and hereby ratifies and approves the award of a contract to Shauger Property Services, Inc., 429 Dodd Street, East Orange, New Jersey 07017 for emergency main water and sewer replacements on Thomas Street (between Burnside St and Carroll St) in the City of Orange Township under the emergency provisions established by N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 in the total amount not to exceed \$1,679,416.95.

## Description of Work Report

### Emergency Sewer Main and Sanitary Storm Replacement

**LOCATION:** Thomas Street and Burnside Street, City of Orange

**SCOPE OF WORK:** INVESTIGATION

On June 23, 2023, called out National Water Main (NWM) to investigate what was reported by the EPA to be raw sewage escaping into the Second River Brook. Upon further investigation, there was visual confirmation, specifically at the end of Kearny Street where sewage was evident running into the brook. (NWM) personell along with Shauger Property Services, Inc. (SPS) Supervisors walked the brook as far as possible to try and follow the leak. (NWM) continued its investigation by videoing the storm line that runs under (SPS) parking lot, to Dodd Street and connects to a storm inlet at the intersection of Dodd Street and Thomas Blvd. That inlet showed signs of raw sewage running through it. As we videoed further, a manhole halfway up Thomas Blvd. was surcharged, filled with sewage. (NWM) Jetted that line and broke free any blockage. As the video camera showed, the problem was discovered at the intersection of Thomas Street and Burnside Street where we found an underground storm drain directly under the sewer line, causing the storm and sewer to co-mingle, releasing raw sewage into the

**SCOPE OF WORK:** WORK PERFORMED

**Day 1: 6-23-2023:** Investigated, found area of leakage, set up traffic control and proceeded to temporarily install concrete over the storm line to help prevent co-mingling in the manhole.

**Day 2: 6-27-2023:** Mobilized, set up trench boxes, road plates and delivered Storm Manhole #1

**Day 3: 6-28-2023:** Excavate 10x10x12' trench to install new storm manhole and risers, abandon the storm line from existing manhole and connect into new storm manhole. Form concrete channel inverts at base of manhole.

**Day 4 thru 8: 6-29-2023 to 7-18-2023:** Make connection into sanitary manhole with new 8" sewer line and connection into new storm manhole with 8" storm then continue to install an 8" sanitary line and an 8" storm line simultaneously, for about 250 LF each with a 12' wide trench to the intersection of Thomas Street and Carroll Street.

**Day 8-9: 7-18-2023 and 7-19-2023:** After pipe install complete for both sewer and storm, tie in new sanitary line to existing sanitary manhole on each side. Installed new storm manhole w/risers and installed 12' of 8" PVC to tie in to new storm manhole. Then added about 10 LF of 8" PVC storm pipe from new storm manhole to existing storm manhole to act as an over flow. Form concrete channel inverts at base of manhole.

**Day 10: 7-20-2023:** Install manhole ladder in new storm manhole along with a new frame and cover. Finished channel invert in manhole base. Connect to existing storm under drain pipe.

**Day 11-12: 7-24 to 7-28 2023:** Perform all necessary restoration including new sidewalk in front of driveway where sanitary tie in was performed and storm was connected. Paved approximately 600 SY of asphalt.

## Description of Work Report

### Emergency Sewer Main and Sanitary Storm Replacement

**LOCATION:** Thomas Street and Burnside Street, City of Orange

**SCOPE OF WORK: INVESTIGATION**

On June 23, 2023, called out National Water Main (NWM) to investigate what was reported by the EPA to be raw sewage escaping into the Second River Brook. Upon further investigation, there was visual confirmation, specifically at the end of Kearny Street where sewage was evident running into the brook. (NWM) personnell along with Shauger Property Services, Inc. (SPS) Supervisors walked the brook as far as possible to try and follow the leak. (NWM) continued its investigation by videoing the storm line that runs under (SPS) parking lot, to Dodd Street and connects to a storm Inlet at the intersection of Dodd Street and Thomas Blvd. That inlet showed signs of raw sewage running through it. As we videoed further, a manhole halfway up Thomas Blvd. was surcharged, filled with sewage. (NWM) Jetted that line and broke free any blockage. As the video camera showed, the problem was discovered at the intersection of Thomas Street and Burnside Street where we found an underground storm drain directly under the sewer line, causing the storm and sewer to co- mingle, releasing raw sewage into the

**SCOPE OF WORK: WORK PERFORMED**

**Day 1: 6-23-2023:** Investigated, found area of leakage, set up traffic control and proceeded to temporarily install concrete over the storm line to help prevent co-mingling in the manhole.

**Day 2: 6-27-2023:** Mobilized, set up trench boxes, road plates and delivered Storm Manhole #1

**Day 3: 6-28-2023:** Excavate 10x10x12' trench to install new storm manhole and risers, abandon the storm line from existing manhole and connect into new storm manhole. Form concrete channel inverts at base of manhole.

**Day 4 thru 8: 6-29-2023 to 7-18-2023:** Make connection into sanitary manhole with new 8" sewer line and connection into new storm manhole with 8" storm then continue to install an 8" sanitary line and an 8" storm line simultaneously, for about 250 LF each with a 12' wide trench to the intersection of Thomas Street and Carroll Street

**Day 8-9: 7-18-2023 and 7-19-2023:** After pipe install complete for both sewer and storm, tie in new sanitary line to existing sanitary manhole on each side. Installed new storm manhole w/risers and installed 12' of 8" PVC to tie in to new storm manhole. Then added about 10 LF of 8" PVC storm pipe from new storm manhole to existing storm manhole to act as an over flow. Form concrete channel inverts at base of manhole.

**Day 10: 7-20-2023:** Install manhole ladder in new storm manhole along with a new frame and cover. Finished channel invert in manhole base. Connect to existing storm under drain pipe.

**Day 11-12: 7-24 to 7-28 2023:** Perform all necessary restoration including new sidewalk in front of driveway where sanitary tie in was performed and storm was connected. Paved approximately 600 SY of asphalt.
