ESSEX COUNTY

Essex County Liaison, Reginald Bledsoe introduced himself and gave a few updates. Essex County has begun the DARE Management program at the South Mountain Reservation location which is held every Tuesday, January 16th January 23rd, January 30th, February 6th and February 13th. The DARE Management program at the Hilltop Reservation location will be held Thursday's, January 11th, January 18th, January 25th, February 1st, February 8th, February 22nd. He announced Essex County will continue with the 18th Annual Project Homeless Connect on Wednesday, January 24th from 10:00am – 2:00pm at Essex County College Gymnasium on West Market Street in Newark, New Jersey. On Monday, February 26th, 7:00pm at the Essex County Hospital Center, 204 Grove Avenue, Cedar Grove, NJ, County Executive Joseph D. DiVincenzo will deliver the State of the County Address. Councilmembers who wish to attend should RSVP and arrive at 6:00pm. He will inquire about the progress of the new Senior Center. Council President Tency A. Eason requested a list of activities and his contact information be sent to the Clerk's Office for distribution. Council Vice President Clifford R. Ross welcomed Mr. Bledsoe and inquired about the fence at Orange Park. Mr. Bledsoe stated there are plans for work at Orange Park at the request of this governing body and Mayor Dwayne D. Warren, Esq. He will get the specifications and update the body shortly. Councilmember Quantavia L. Hilbert welcomed Mr. Bledsoe and wants to work with him on the safety on County roads.

COVID Update

Health Officer Vincent DeFilippo stated Essex County is the third highest in the state for Covid cases. There has been cases of measles and monkey pox. People with low immune systems should wear masks. The department is working with the county to administer vaccines. Whelps are symptoms of Monkey Pox which is highly contagious and the vaccine is not as effective as anticipated. There has not been any cases of Monkey Pox reported in Orange. There is a pricing mandate stating prices need to be posted. There are no cannabis dispensaries on Main Street but there is one in the valley near Librettis.
