Alysa Rodriguez of 487 Mountainview Avenue expressed her concerns about reducing Citizens Comments time, \$2 million grant, and the salary increase ordinance. The CFO explained the \$2 million grant is in the budget.

Darnelle Gibbs of 400 Lincoln Avenue expressed concerns about Resolution 408-2025 and the \$2 million grant.

E. Lydell Carter of 196 Clairmont Terrace expressed concerns about Ordinance 58-2025 hoping this passes because there is a danger at the intersection.

Brent Engle of 174 Heywood Avenue expressed concerns about Ordinance 62-2025 and is curious why a Bond Ordinance is being used and also agreed that Ordinance 62-2025 should be passed.

ED Donnely of 419 Central Avenue expressed concerns about Resolution 414-2025 and the funds so that jobs would be saved. The safety of the city is what needs to be discussed.

Shawn O’Grady of 419 Central Avenue is from the Fire Fighters Union and he wanted to speak about the safety in the city and saving jobs of Fire Fighters.

Dr. Gloria Boseman of 345 Olcott Street inquired about Resolutions 416-2025, 429-2025, the infrastructure going up, the Library, and she thanked the Fire Fighters for their service.

Harold Johnson of 235 Fuller Terrace spoke about financial literacy and National Life Insurance Month.

Gerald Murphy of 26 South Harrison Street spoke about the soil at Berwyn Street, and the main on Berwyn.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Quantavia L. Hilbert thanked the Citizens who came out for the Council Meeting. She agreed with Dr. Boseman when negotiating with Developers, and began questions about Permit Parking, Air BNB, and the ADU.

Councilmember Kerry J. Coley spoke to the leak on Main Street, the Berwyn Street Development, contamination on Berwyn mentioned by a resident, and repaving on William Street.

Councilmember Tency A. Eason spoke to DMV coming to St. Matthew, Pink Out in Orange which was a collaboration with East Orange, the Salary Ordinance which she abstained from as she did not support it, uniforms for Crossing Guards, Community Forums and she stated she supports Fire and Police.

Council Vice President Weldon M. Montague, III requested updates on the Parking Utility, Parking Meters, Orange Memorial Site, YMCA Site, and the old Fire Station. He stated he supports Fire and Police as well.

Councilmember Clifford R. Ross thanked the Fire Department for showing up in large numbers for the Council Meeting. He stated Councilmembers do not support lay-offs. He mentioned success of the Pink Out Walk which was held this past Saturday. He requested updates on LIA Development, Gates, the Clairmont Terrace Ordinance, and the upcoming election.

Councilmember Jamie B. Summers-Johnson spoke to Citizens Comments made about lay-offs, and how she work with residents.

Council President Adrienne K. Wooten spoke to the Fire Union and intimidation. She wanted to address some bad rumors.

Council President Adrienne K. Wooten suspended the rules to hear from Senator Britnee Timberlake.

Senator Britnee Timberlake stated she has historically had a good relationship with the City of Orange Township. She was able to go to Trenton and get funds for the City of Orange Township to save jobs in the City. She is in support of First Responders and Civil Service workers and wanted the residents to know this. She is committed to be a partner with the city and wanted to make it clear that the funds she acquired was to be used for Fire, Police and already laid-off employees.

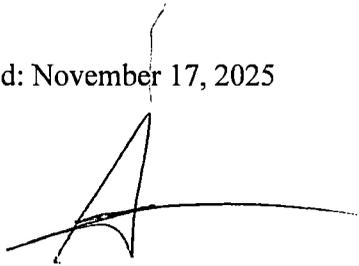

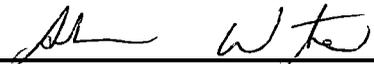
