For January 2026, the Clerk's Office collected \$151.32, Community Service collected \$15,927.00, the Health Department collected \$16,678.00, the Planning Board Department collected \$56,982.00, Parking Meters collected \$3,398.27, and Public Works collected \$8,961.00. CITIZEN COMMENTS ON GENERAL ISSUES/AGENDA ITEMS

Members of the public wishing to address the Council may do so during this portion of the meeting. Speakers must sign their name on the Comments Sign-Up sheet and approach the microphone, when called upon. To allow maximum public involvement, each speaker is permitted one 3-minute period to interact with the Council and must provide his or her name and street address prior to beginning any remarks. Visual aids are not permitted.

Speakers are reminded to be courteous and mindful of other individuals. Each person has the right to speak on any subject but is responsible for abuse of that right. The City bears no liability for any comments made by the public and maintains discretion to remove any person engaging in obscene or disruptive conduct. The Council will consider all comments and questions, and will respond, if and when appropriate, which may or may not be during this meeting.

Alysa Rodriguez of 487 Mountainview Avenue, addressed several matters, including OPRA requests and the status of the Fire and Police study. She inquired about street paving projects and whether sidewalk improvements would be completed in conjunction with roadway work. Ms. Rodriguez also raised questions regarding affordable housing, Resolutions 119-2026 and 126-2026, the City's new insurance coverage, ongoing issues on Scotland Road, rodent concerns, and walk-on resolutions.

Dr. Gloria Boseman of 345 Olcott Street, stated that although she does not always receive responses to her questions during Council meetings, she intends to continue attending meetings and voicing her concerns. She commented on the impact of new development within the City, low-income capacity, affordable housing, the municipal hiring process, renters insurance, prevention of disease spread, the Trust Fund, and the need for greater community engagement. She emphasized her responsibility as a voting resident to ask questions and remain actively involved in City matters.

Jason Grove of even Oaks Road expressed his appreciation to the Department Heads for participating in the recent Community Meeting, noting that he was able to engage in meaningful discussions and receive clarification on several of his concerns. He also shared his frustration regarding ongoing traffic issues and expressed hope that a comprehensive plan could be implemented to better inform residents of traffic pattern changes, possibly through text alerts and phone notifications.

Kweli Campbell of 55 Randolph Place shared her thoughts regarding the proposed renovations to Metcalf Park, the Open Space and Recreation, Historic Preservation Committee, recent increases to the water bill, noise levels throughout the City, congestion concerns, and Community Benefits Agreements. In response, Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk addressed her concerns regarding PFAS, explaining the differences between the new construction site and the previous site. He noted that the construction project is expected to go out to bid soon.

CITIZENS COMMENTS continued

Antoinett Hall of 214 Duane Street expressed concerns regarding heating issues at 400 Oakwood Avenue, 300 Oakwood Avenue, and 210 Central Place. Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk stated that portions of the investigation have been completed; however, the matter remains under active review and the investigation is ongoing.

A motion to Close Citizen Comments was made by Councilmember Jamie B. Summers-Johnson and seconded by Councilmember Clifford R. Ross.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Quantavia L. Hilbert extended well wishes to residents for a meaningful Black History Month. She thanked the Police Department, Fire Department, and Department of Public Works for their efforts during recent snow removal operations. She also expressed concerns regarding the cleanliness of the City and the enforcement of codes related to trash receptacles. In response, Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk stated that both commercial and residential compliance “blitz” efforts had been conducted to remind property owners and residents of code requirements pertaining to proper trash receptacle placement and maintenance.

Councilmember Tency A. Eason thanked residents for their patience and cooperation during the recent snow removal operations. She urged everyone to exercise caution, noting that black ice can be particularly hazardous. She also encouraged residents to check on and assist neighbors in need, especially senior citizens, during periods of inclement weather.

Councilmember Kerry J. Coley thanked residents for their patience and cooperation during the recent snow removal operations. He also noted concerns regarding a construction site that has not been adequately cleaning the area upon completion of its work and stated that the responsible parties should be directed to maintain proper site cleanliness.

Council Vice President Weldon M. Montague, III inquired about the status of the Recreation Center and the Parking Utility. He also asked whether Parking Utility employees would be City of Orange Township residents. Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk confirmed that only Orange residents are being interviewed for those positions. Additionally, Council Vice President Montague requested an update on the parking meters from Main Street to Park Avenue, noting that the meters have been ordered. He announced a series of free tax preparation events for households earning under \$69,000. The sessions will be held from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the following locations: February 19th, 400 Oakwood Avenue; February 26th, 300 Orange Road; March 5th, Salem Towers; and March 12th, Council Chambers. These are presented by Councilmember Kerry J. Coley, Council Vice President Weldon M. Montague, III, and Councilmember Clifford R. Ross. Residents are asked to bring a photo ID, Social Security card, W-2s, 1099 forms, and Form 1095-A. Council Vice President Montague, III also announced that he and Councilmember Clifford R. Ross will be sponsoring children to attend summer camp for students in grades 5th through 11th. The camp will take place July 19th through July 24th in Lebanon, Pennsylvania. Flyers are available for additional information.

COUNCIL COMMENTS continued

Councilmember Clifford R. Ross inquired about the status of barriers that were to be installed on Scotland Road. Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk stated that he would review the Planning Board study and contact the County Engineer for follow-up. Councilmember Ross also asked about security coverage at the front entrance of City Hall and why metal detectors currently being used at another municipal building could not be utilized there. Business Administrator Hartwyk responded that alternative plans are under review, including hiring outside armed security personnel to monitor the entrance. He was unaware of the metal detectors. Additionally, Councilmember Ross revisited the suggestion made at the previous meeting by Councilmember Kerry J. Coley regarding a warming station and asked whether the Upper Field House could also be considered as a possible location. He concluded his remarks by thanking everyone who attended the recent Community Meeting.

Councilmember Jamie B. Summers-Johnson recently attended the Valentine's Day fundraiser at Orange High School and noted that those wishing to contribute could send checks directly to the school. She also served as a guest speaker for a virtual event at Zion Hill Church, where she highlighted her role as the first Black woman Councilmember representing the South Ward of the City of Orange Township. During her remarks, she referenced the recent Community Meeting and spoke about Mother Fleury, who tragically lost her husband and two daughters in a fire. She acknowledged the ongoing community efforts to assist Mother Fleury and encouraged donations to support her. Councilmember Summers-Johnson also announced the passing of one of Orange's longtime lifeguards. She shared information about an upcoming event for caregivers, being organized in collaboration with Council President Adrienne K. Wooten and District Leader Veronica Scott, which will take place on the third Sunday in March. Additionally, she inquired with Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk regarding mirrors that are to be installed on Scotland Road; he confirmed that the mirrors have been ordered and will notify her on the day they are installed.

Council President Adrienne K. Wooten wished everyone a Happy Black History Month, noting that she celebrates Black history every day and credits her parents for instilling its significance in her life. She spoke about the recent Community Meeting and highlighted the upcoming caregiver event mentioned by Councilmember Summers-Johnson.




