CITIZEN COMMENTS ON GENERAL ISSUES/AGENDA ITEMS

Members of the public wishing to address the Council may do so during this portion of the meeting. Speakers must sign their name on the Comments Sign-Up sheet and approach the microphone, when called upon. To allow maximum public involvement, each speaker is permitted one 3-minute period to interact with the Council and must provide his or her name and street address prior to beginning any remarks. Visual aids are not permitted.

Speakers are reminded to be courteous and mindful of other individuals. Each person has the right to speak on any subject but is responsible for abuse of that right. The City bears no liability for any comments made by the public and maintains discretion to remove any person engaging in obscene or disruptive conduct. The Council will consider all comments and questions, and will respond, if and when appropriate, which may or may not be during this meeting.

Alysa Rodriguez of 487 Mountainview Avenue, addressed the Council and expressed concerns regarding the Grant, Resolution Drafting, PVC railing, Tax Sales, Legislative Research Officer, Citizens Comments, and Low Income housing. Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk spoke to some of her concerns.

Dr. Gloria Boseman of 345 Olcott Street, stated that although she does not always receive answers to her questions during Council meetings, she intends to continue attending and raising her concerns. She spoke on issues including the impact of new development, low income capacity, the hiring process, the library fundraising, and her obligation to question things in a city she votes in.

CITIZENS COMMENTS continued

Sheranda Volmar of 464 Valley Street expressed concerns about rodents and cats in the valley. Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk will connect her with the Health Officer.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Tency A. Eason expressed her sincere appreciation to everyone who offered condolences on the passing of her nephew and City employee, Ronald Mozell, Sr. She extended special thanks to her Council colleagues and the Deputy Clerk for the beautiful plant that was sent in his memory. She also requested that the Business Administrator provide clarification regarding the mailing of tax bills to ensure residents fully understand the process. In addition, Councilmember Eason addressed the importance of crisis management during the cold season, highlighting the need for accessible warming centers and homeless shelters to support vulnerable residents.

Councilmember Jamie B. Summers-Johnson requested that the City's snow removal process be published so residents can better understand how it operates. She also inquired about the traffic mirrors she previously requested for installation at Scotland Road and Argyle Avenue. Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk reported that the mirrors arrived today and that an installation date will be scheduled shortly. Councilmember Summers-Johnson further asked about the status of the traffic study for Claremont Terrace. Business Administrator Hartwyk indicated that he will provide a report from the Engineer. She also raised concerns regarding gas leak issues involving PSE&G in the South Ward and noted that the building at 749 Scotland Road is experiencing heating problems. Code Enforcement is currently addressing these matters.

Councilmember Clifford R. Ross extended well wishes for a meaningful Black History Month, encouraging everyone to remain in a spirit of reflection. He also addressed the recent snow removal efforts, acknowledging the significant volume of snowfall and urging residents to remain patient. Councilmember Ross asked Business Administrator Hartwyk to outline both the challenges faced and the successes achieved in the City's snow removal operations, noting that the sheer amount of snow required not only extensive effort but also adequate locations for snow disposal.

Councilmember Quantavia L. Hilbert extended well wishes for a meaningful Black History Month. She expressed concerns regarding immigration matters and referenced the recent incident on Scotland Road. Councilmember Hilbert also discussed issues related to City-owned properties and addressed concerns about snow removal operations.

Councilmember Kerry J. Coley raised questions regarding the Lincoln Avenue Traffic Study, Ordinance 72-2026, which will be postponed. He also inquired about the City's snow removal efforts, including questions about the snow removal equipment and the costs associated with the machinery. Additionally, he requested information about the City's Emergency Snow Removal Plan. Councilmember Coley addressed heating issues at the senior building located at 400 Oakwood Avenue. The Business Administrator reported that Code Enforcement has issued at least 27 tickets related to the matter, an emergency has been declared, and steps will be taken to enter the building and resolve the problem.

COUNCIL COMMENTS continued

Council Vice President Weldon M. Montague, III extended well wishes for a meaningful Black History Month. He addressed the ongoing heating issues and the availability of warming centers, expressing hope that the Fire Chief will provide public safety information advising residents not to use stoves to heat their homes. He requested that the Recreation Department attend a future Conference Meeting during the Matters of Discussion portion of the agenda to provide an overview of recreation and sports programs. Council Vice President Montague also announced that he and Councilmember Clifford R. Ross will be sponsoring children to attend summer camp. Additionally, he inquired whether the Brook Alley Gas Station is fully operational and was informed that it is. He also asked about the timeline and projected completion date for Joyce Carnegie Park; Business Administrator Chris Hartwyk stated that he will look into the details and provide an update. Finally, it was announced that residents earning under \$60,000 annually will have access to free tax preparation services.


